Welcome Reception at the City Hall

It is a beautiful and well known building, used for the yearly Nobel Banquet. The City Hall is known for its hospitality, its unique art treasures, magnificent banquettes and an intriguing history attracting close to 400,000 visitors a year.

From the City Hall, the City of Stockholm is governed. Around 200 politicians and

civil servants have their offices in this building.

The Vasa is the world's only surviving 17th-century ship and one of the foremost tourist sights in the world. The ship is displayed in the purpose-built museum. We will have a guided tour of the ship and its history before the dinner.

Monday Oct 20, 19.30 Dress: semiformal The banquet with the signing ceremony will take place at the banquet hall at the Clarion Hotel Stockholm.

LOCATION

The venue for the conference is the Clarion Hotel, Stockholm. The Clarion Hotel Stockholm offers 532 rooms and luxurious suites, conference venues for 2 to 500 delegates, banqueting facilities for 800 persons, gardens, à la carte restaurant, live music lobby café, bars, contemporary art, relaxation and a neighbourhood worth exploring.

The hotel is located in Södermalm, the heart of Stockholm less than 10 minutes from the central station. The hotel is easily reached by underground, bus or taxi, see <u>transportation</u>. Offering a modern, international atmosphere the hotel will also be the perfect setting for the meetings.

For delegates to the conference the most convenient will be to stay at the Clarion, as all meetings and some of the social events will take place there. The secretariats for ILAC, IAF and the conference secretariat will also be situated there.

ACCOMODATION

Accomodation has been reserved for conference delegates at the official conference hotel: the Clarion Hotel Stockholm. ABOUT STOCKHOLM

Stockholm is the capital of SWEDEN with a history that goes back to the 13th century. The mediaeval Old City (Gamla Stan) is still the centre of Stockholm. Today Stockholm has about one million inhabitants.

Stockholm is one of the world's most beautiful capitals as it is originally built on a number of islands between Lake Mälaren and the Baltic Sea. The different areas of Stockholm have their own characteristics which you may discover when touring around the city or taking a walk. The Clarion Hotel Stockholm is situated in the southern part of the city: Södermalm, which is built on a number of hills. From some points you may have a panorama view over Stockholm.

Stockholm offers a large number of museums, theatres, restaurants, sights and various events for all different interests: concerts, opera, ballet, art exhibitions etc. There are several attractions like the Royal Palace with the changing of the guards and the Vasa museum that are within walking distance from the Clarion Hotel Stockholm - or easily reached by the underground or city buses. EATING OUT AND ENTERTAINMENT

Restaurants & Nightlife

There are a variety of restaurants, coffee shops and bars in Stockholm. You may choose to try the traditional Swedish food, like fish and seafood, or the international cuisine. Tipping

At restaurants, taxes and a service charge are included in the bill, but a small gratuity is expected for evening meals (approx. 7-10%).

How to Get to Stockholm

There are four airports in the area of Stockholm: Stockholm Arlanda Airport, Bromma Airport, Skavsta Airport and Västerås Airport.

Stockholm Arlanda Airport

The main airport with international and national flight connections. Transfers: The Arlanda Express Train operates from Arlanda Airport to Stockholm Central Station every 15 minutes (every 30 min on Saturdays) Journey time: 20 min. For timetable and fares: <u>www.arlandaexpress.com</u>

Transfers:

Airport buses to the City Terminal (close to the Central Station) every 10 minutes from 4.50 a.m. to 11.45 p.m. (from 6.45 a.m. at weekends). From 11.05 p.m. buses also operate through the night in connection with flights. Buses depart from the City Terminal from 4.00 a.m. to 10.00 p.m. daily. Transfers: Taxi

Journey time varies due to traffic, about 40 min.

Fare: A number of taxi companies operate in Stockholm and their rates may vary. We recommend you to use the companies offering a fixed price which should be Taxi Stockholm, Taxi 020, Taxi Kurir, Freys hyrverk, Flygtaxi.

Bromma Airport

The airport closest to Stockholm City. Transfers: Buses from Bromma to the City Terminal connect with incoming flights. Journey time: 20 min For timetable and fares: <u>www.flygbussarna.se</u>

Skavsta Airport

(100 km from Stockholm) Transfers: Airport buses link all Ryanair arrivals/departures at Skavsta Airport with the Stockholm City Terminal. Journey time:1 hr 20 min. For timetable and fares: <u>www.flygbussarna.se</u>

Västerås Airport

(106 km from Stockholm) Airport buses link all Ryanair arrivals/departures at Västerås Airport with the Stockholm City Terminal. Journey time: 1 hr 15 min. For timetable and fares: www.flygbussarna.se

From the Central Station

there are underground/metro connections to the Clarion Hotel Stockholm. The nearest stop is Skanstull. For a full description of the hotel and how to get there, visit

Shopping

In Stockhom city, department stores remain open until 7.00 p.m. or longer Monday - Saturday. Some are also open on Sundays between 12 noon and 4.00 p.m. Shops generally close early the day before a public holiday.

Tax-free shopping

In Sweden, value-added tax (VAT) is always included in the purchase price. If you reside outside the European Union (EU), you are entitled to a tax refund on your purchases. In Sweden, as in most European countries, Value Added Tax is included in the sales price on the tag.

Tax Free Shopping by Global Refund is a simple system that puts cash in your hand when you leave the EU. You get refunds of up to 15-18% on your purchases. The minimum purchase is SEK 200.

Shopping Areas

The biggest shopping areas stretch from Hötorget to Gamla Stan, via Drottninggatan, and from Hamngatan, Kungsgatan, and Biblioteksgatan down to Stureplan. Normal business hours are 10 a.m. to 6 a.m. Monday-Friday and around 10 a.m. to 3 p.m. on Saturdays. Many stores are also open on Sundays. If you want to buy a lot and are short on time, go to the big department stores, Gallerian or Sturegallerian. They stay open 7 days a week, with longer hours during the week than on weekends. http://www.stockholmtown.com

Sightseeing

Stockholm is one of the world's most beautiful capitals. Built on 14 islands around one of Europe's largest and best-preserved mediaeval city centres. The city is also interesting because each neighbourhood has its own unique 'personality', so a short promenade sometimes turns into a long walking tour.

The heights of Söder and Gamla Stan, dating from the Middle Ages, are very different from Djurgården's fantastic woods and the shopping areas in the City.

Stockholm offers a wealth of museums, theatres, sights, attractions and events. You will allways find something to do whether your interest lies in history, art, opera, modern dance, traditional handicraft, contemporary design or anything else.

There are about a hundred museums, many centrally situated like the Royal Palace and the Vasa Museum. By walking around you can do both shopping and sightseeing in the neighbourhood of the Clarion Hotel Stockholm.

GENERAL INFORMATION

Sweden, Facts and Figures

Sweden is a constitutional monarchy, in which King Carl XVI Gustaf is Head of the nation, but royal power has long been limited to official and ceremonial functions.

The nation's legislature is the Swedish Parliament (Riksdag), with 349 members. Parliamentary elections are held every four years. The government is appointed by the Riksdag. The prime minister is the chairman of the Moderates, Mr Fredrik Reinfeldt.

- Capital: Stockholm, about 1 million inhabitants
- Population: 9 million inhabitants
- Languages: Swedish; recognized minority languages: Sami, Finnish, Meänkieli (Tornedalen Finnish), Yiddish, Romani Chib.

Weather

The average temperature in Stockholm in October will be about +10 degrees Celsius. Evenings and nights will be colder. It may be useful to bring an umbrella or raincoat.

Currency and Prices

The Swedish currency is Swedish Kronor, SEK. 1 Krona = 100 Öre. There is no limit to the amount of Swedish and foreign currencies taken into Sweden. For exchange rates to different currencies, visit <u>www.xe.com</u> or your bank office.

Credit Cards

Major credit cards are widely accepted throughout Sweden at banks, hotels, stores, restaurants, taxis etc. In many cases your identity card will be required for paying with a credit card. You may withdraw cash from your Visa, MasterCard, Maestro, Cirrus or American Express Card at any "Bankomat" or "Minuten - ATM".

Traveller's Checks

Traveller's checks are generally accepted as payment throughout Sweden. Change will be given in Swedish Kronor. Please note that a fee is charged when using the checks as payment.

Electricity

Electric Current

The normal electric current in Sweden is 220 volts AC in 50 cycles and plugs and sockets may differ from those in other parts of the world. Travellers should bring adapters or transformers. The hotel may supply adapters.

Electronic Equipment

Laptop computers that are made to work on both 110 and 220 volts can be used in Sweden with an adapter. For laptop computers working on 110 volts only, transformers are also necessary.

Phone and Internet

Telephones/cards

When calling Sweden from abroad use the code +46 for SWEDEN and 8 for

Stockholm. When calling abroad from Sweden: dial 00 plus the country code, followed by the area code and phone number.

There are two types of payphone, using prepaid phone cards or credit cards. Phone cards are available almost everywhere. Credit-card phones (indicated by "CCC") are also widely available. Wireless phones are widely used in Sweden. You can link up to the Telia mobile, Tele2 or Vodaphone GSM networks (900 & 1800 Mhz).

Emergency call, dial 112

The Internet

The conference facilities have wireless internet connection. To use this you will need a laptop with wireless connection or an adapter for this. The network will function with Windows and the most common operating systems. Delegates staying at the Clarion Hotel Stockholm have 8 hours/day free access to the internet included in the room price.

Transportation

Public transport is easily found in Stockholm. For information on underground, buses or commuter trains, maps, fares, time tables etc. visit Stockholm Transport's (SL) website <u>www.sl.se</u>

Close to the Clarion Hotel Stockholm there is an underground/metro stop called 'Skanstull'. The sign to look for is T. As in the Swedish word for underground 'Tunnelbana'. The northbound green or red lines will take you in about five minutes to the stop 'T-Centralen' where they connect to all other underground lines, the commuter trains, the Central Station with the Arlanda Express Train or Airport buses. From here you are in walking distance from the main department stores and shopping areas.

To connect from other hotels to the Clarion Hotel Stockholm you can use the underground. For on-line information and to use the journey planner, visit <u>www.sl.se</u>

Fares

You may buy a ticket for a single trip or for an unlimited number of trips for one, three, seven or 30 days. These travel cards are not restricted to one person, so it is possible to share them with a colleague.

Taxi

We recommend you to use taxis connected to the big taxi companies, whose cars you may identify by signs on the cars. The drivers should also show their identity cards in connection to the instrument panel. Most taxis take credit cards for payment. Taxi drivers

are not entitled to tipping. They may be given a few extra kronor. A good rule may be to round up the fare shown on the meter.

SWEDAC IN BRIEF

SWEDAC, the Swedish Board for Accreditation and Conformity Assessment is a

Swedish governmental authority under the Ministry for Foreign Affairs and the Ministry of Enterprise, Energy and Communications. It is the national accreditation body assessing laboratories, inspection and certification bodies.

SWEDAC is also responsible for legal metrology, precious metals and for the coordination of market surveillance in Sweden. SWEDAC assesses the bodies notified to the European Commission for performing testing and certification according to EC-directives.

The staff are about 110 people, of whom 70 at the head office in Borås and 40 at the Stockholm office. SWEDAC has 2 600 accredited bodies. The annual turnover is 120 million SEK. For more facts about SWEDAC, please visit the website www.swedac.se
